Schroer's responsibilities include overseeing and complete coordination of all aspects of the 21<sup>st</sup> Drug Court program, which is an alternative sentencing program for convicted felons struggling with deep-rooted drug additions, serving Hickman, Lewis, Perry, and Williamson Counties.

A 28-year resident of Williamson County, Schroer's leadership activities have spanned professional, religious, civic, and community arenas, including Board Chairman with Battle of Franklin Trust; member of Franklin First United Methodist Church; Animal Control Task Force Committee Member – Schroer was instrumental in the development of the referendum adopted by Williamson County due to resulting efforts of this task force; Friends of Vanderbilt Children's Hospital, serving as Fundraising Chair; and Carnton Plantation Board Chair, 2003-09. In 2010 Schroer was named Volunteer of the Year by the Battle of Franklin Trust; additionally the organization was the recipient of the Chairman's Award from the Civil War Trust, Randal McGavock Award winner.

Schroer holds a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Kentucky; her graduate studies include a Master of Arts from Trevecca Nazarene University. She is also a licensed Senior Psychological Examiner.

An enthusiastic supporter of all the City of Franklin has to offer, reflecting upon her upcoming Leadership Franklin experience, Schroer states, "I am anxious to learn as much as possible about this wonderful community in which we live. I hope to utilize that information in ways that will benefit Franklin in the future."
